# **REGIONAL NETWORK**

New sector classification and new weights in Norges Bank's regional network



# Background

Up to and including the 1/2015 survey, the sector classification for Norges Bank's regional network comprised the main series manufacturing, construction, retail trade, services and the local government and hospital sector. Manufacturing was divided into the subsectors domestically-oriented manufacturing, export industry and oil service industry. The services sector was divided into the subsectors commercial services and household services. The oil service industry only comprised manufacturing enterprises that supply petroleum-related goods to the Norwegian market. This means that exporters in petroleum-related manufacturing were defined as part of the export industry. Furthermore, petroleum-related turnover in service enterprises was defined as services.

In recent years, there has been a sharp increase in petroleum-related exports and services. Since these activities were included in sectors that also contain non-petroleum-related activities, it was difficult to see the overall effect of the petroleum sector on the Norwegian economy in the numbers from Norges Bank's regional network. Similarly, it was difficult to follow developments in the traditional export industry and non-petroleum-related services. To obtain a clearer overview of the direct effects of the petroleum sector on the Norwegian economy, we have now gathered the petroleum-related enterprises in a new and broader "oil service industry". The new sector covers enterprises located in Norway that deliver petroleum-specific goods *and* services to oil companies and other oil service companies in Norway *and* in other countries. The new oil service sector thus includes both petroleum-specific manufacturing and petroleum-specific services and is divided into subsectors depending on whether they primarily serve the domestic market or the export market.

In connection with the update of the weights used in Norges Bank's regional network, the method for calculating the weights has also been changed somewhat. The weights for the main sectors in the regional network are calculated by using the national accounts and regional accounts, but the breakdown by subsector was largely determined on the basis of judgment. In the calculation of the new weights, the desire has been to use statistics to a greater extent and to rely less on assessments based on judgment. For the new weights, the national accounts and regional accounts for 2012 are used, while the previous weights were based on account figures from 2009.

#### New sector structure

The "oil service industry" has been added to the sector structure as a new main sector. The oil service industry comprises enterprises that deliver petroleum-specific goods or services to Norwegian or foreign enterprises.

In the ongoing analysis work on Norges Bank's regional network, the individual enterprise is categorised on the basis of what it produced and for which markets. Many regional network enterprises deliver goods or services to several markets. Such enterprises may face different developments in the various markets they deliver to. Thus, a single enterprise can be included in more than one sector in the regional network. For example, an enterprise may export both petroleum-specific and non-petroleum specific products.

In such cases, the enterprise's development for its non-petroleum-specific products will be included in the series for the export industry, and its development for its petroleum-related products will be included in the series for the export-oriented oil service industry.

Chart 1 below shows the changes to the sector structure in *manufacturing* and *services*. The other main sectors, *construction*, *retail trade* and the *local government and hospital sector* are unchanged from the previous structure and are thus omitted from the chart.




Chart 1 - Changes to industries in Norges Bank's regional network

# Weight types

In Norges Bank's regional network there are three categories of weights: *output weights, employment weights* and *investment weights*.

- *Output weights* are used to calculate the aggregated variables output, market prospects, prices, profitability and capacity utilisation.
- *Employment weights* are used to calculate the aggregated variables employment, labour supply and annual wage growth.
- Investment weights are used to calculate the aggregated variables for investment.

For all three categories of weights, *regional weights*, *national sector weights* and *regional sector weights* have been calculated.

- *Regional weights* are the individual regions' shares of the variable (gross product, employment or investment) for a sector relative to the country as a whole.
- Regional sector weights are the individual sectors' shares of the variable in a region.
- *National sector weights* are the individual sectors' shares of the variable for the country as a whole.

## Calculation of weights for sectors and subsectors

The weights for the main sectors in Norges Bank's regional network were previously calculated by using the national and regional accounts<sup>1</sup>. The manufacturing sector's share of exports was calculated with the aid of the export accounts. The breakdown between domestically-oriented manufacturing and the oil industry supplier sector and the breakdown between household services and commercial services was determined on the basis of judgment.

In the calculation of the new weights, our desire has been to continue to use the national and regional accounts as a basis. At the same time, we wanted to use account figures to a greater extent also in the calculation of subsector weights.

The oil service industry is not a separate sector in the national accounts. However, Statistics Norway has an overview of how much the various subsectors in the national accounts deliver to the petroleum sector. The criterion for being defined as the "oil service industry" means that in 2012, at least half of the sector's domestic delivery of gross output went to the industries oil production, pipeline transport, the supplier segment, service activities incidental to oil and gas, oil platform and module construction and shipbuilding. In this context, domestic deliveries are defined as gross output minus deliveries for export, changes in stocks and deliveries to other enterprises in the same sector. The calculations were done by Statistics Norway on the basis of cross-sector data for the entire country for 2012. This means that in the calculation of the weights, we have defined the following subsectors in the national accounts as the oil service industry:

- Supplier segment
- Service activities incidental to oil and gas
- Oil platform and module construction
- Shipbuilding
- Architectural activities and technical consultancy and technical testing and analysis

In the calculation of the weights, the other manufacturing and service subsectors have been defined as manufacturing and services, respectively.

It is important to note that this classification is only used in the calculation of the weights. In the ongoing analysis work on Norges Bank's regional network, the individual enterprise is placed in one or more sectors, depending on what the enterprise produces and the markets it delivers goods or services to.

#### Calculation of export shares for manufacturing and the oil service industry

The export shares in manufacturing and the oil service industry are calculated in several steps. On the basis of cross-sector data from the national accounts,<sup>2</sup> Statistics Norway first calculated how the deliveries (gross output) from manufacturing and the oil service industry was broken down by export market and domestic market for the entire country. The various national export shares were then used to break down the gross products by export deliveries in the corresponding manufacturing and oil service industries in each county.<sup>3</sup> The calculated gross products were then summed to aggregate values for export shares in manufacturing and the oil service industry in each region. The regional shares of the export industry and the oil service industry are therefore determined by the size of the various subsectors in the different regions.

#### Calculation of households' share of services

The gross product in the main sector "Services" has been broken down into the subsectors "Commercial services" and "Household services".

The calculation was performed in two steps. First, the share of gross output delivered to households was calculated for all subsectors in services in the national accounts. Then the national shares for household services in each subsector were used as the basis for calculating the regions' shares of household services from the regional accounts. The regional shares of household services are therefore determined by the size of the subsectors in the various regions.

## Conclusion

The introduction of new series with related new weights has resulted in a break in the published aggregates. In order to compare the series from the 2/2015 survey with the 1/2015 survey, we have calculated the values for the 1/2015 survey using the new sector structure and new weights. The difference between the two versions of the 1/2015 survey shows that the new sector structure and the new weights result in minor changes in the aggregates for the Norwegian economy as a whole. Table 2 shows the national aggregates using the new weights and new sector structure and compares them with the old weights and old sector structure.

The cross-sector data are calculated on the basis of a number of assumptions, including that different uses of a product have the same fixed ratio of supplier industries. The modifications in Statistics Norway's cross-sector data include the treatment of purchases/sales of used fixed assets and foreigners' consumption in Norway.
